





It also brings us happiness and fulfillment. After we helped someone, we feel very happy, because we did something for a good cause, especially when we are doing it with a






ethnic minority children with their Chinese homework. Although my Chinese is not strong, I understand how helpless they may feel at home. Hence, even simple instruction


can make them feel a lot more relieved. It's through this sense of relieve that I gained satisfaction and happiness. It also increases my self-worthiness. Moreover,




